#### NOTICES BY THE GENERAL BOARD

# Directorship and Curatorship of the Museum of Classical Archaeology

The General Board give notice that, on the recommendation of the Museum Committee of the Museum of Classical Archaeology and the Faculty Board of Classics, they have approved amendments to the regulations for the Museum of Classical Archaeology (*Statutes and Ordinances*, p. 603). These amendments establish the office of Director of the Museum (see p. 348) and remove regulations for admission to the Museum. The opportunity has also been taken to confirm that the Museum is an institution within the Faculty of Classics.

#### With immediate effect

MUSEUM OF CLASSICAL ARCHAEOLOGY

(Statutes and Ordinances, p. 603)

By inserting new Regulation 1 below and renumbering the remaining regulations:

1. The Museum of Classical Archaeology shall be an institution within the Faculty of Classics.

Curator of the Museum of Classical Archaeology (Statutes and Ordinances, p. 604)

By rescinding Regulations 1–5 and replacing them with the following:

Director and Curator of the Museum of Classical Archaeology

- 1. There shall be a University office of Director of the Museum of Classical Archaeology, which shall be held in conjunction with another University office.
- **2.** There shall be a University office of Curator of the Museum of Classical Archaeology who shall act under the Director as the executive officer of the Museum. The office of Curator shall not normally be held concurrently with any other University office.
- **3.** Appointments and reappointments to the Director and Curator of the Museum of Classical Archaeology shall be determined by the Committee for the Museum, subject to the approval of the General Board. Appointments to the Directorship shall be for such periods not exceeding three years at a time as the Committee shall determine.
- **4.** The duties of the Director and Curator of the Museum of Classical Archaeology shall be determined by the Committee for the Museum, subject to the approval of the General Board.
  - **5.** The Curator shall act as Secretary to the Committee for the Museum.
- **6.** Under the direction of the Committee, the Director shall exercise a general superintendence over the Museum and its collections and over the staff of the Museum.
- 7. The Director shall be responsible for the maintenance of the catalogues, published and unpublished, of the Museum's collections, and shall undertake such other duties in connection with the administration of the Museum as the Committee shall from time to time direct.
  - **8.** The Director and Curator shall be members of the Faculty of Classics under Statute C, III, 3(b).

Regulations for admission to the Museum of Classical Archaeology (Statutes and Ordinances, p. 604)

By rescinding the regulations in their entirety.

# **Professorship of Stem Cell Medicine: Notice**

The General Board have been informed by the Board of Electors to the Professorship of Stem Cell Medicine that they have been unable to make an election to this Professorship (see *Reporter*, 6198, 2010–11, p. 52). Under the provisions of Statute D, XV, 20(a)(ii), the Board have discontinued the Professorship until 28 February 2013.

The General Board give notice that, on the recommendation of the Faculty Board or other authority concerned, the regulations for certain University examinations have been amended as follows:

# Politics, Psychology, and Sociology (Social and Political Sciences) Tripos, Parts IIA and IIB

(Statutes and Ordinances, p. 415)

#### With effect from 1 October 2013

The list of papers available for Parts IIA and IIB of the Tripos has been amended. Paper Int.3, An interdisciplinary subject I, is no longer suspended.

Regulation 14.

PARTS IIA AND IIB

By removing the footnote indicating suspension of the paper until further notice.

# Language Centre, Certificates of Higher Education in French, German, and Spanish

(Statutes and Ordinances, p. 580)

#### With immediate effect

Regulation 2 is to be amended so as to read:

2. The scheme of examination shall consist of two examinations, each of which shall last for one hour: an examination for aural proficiency and an examination for reading and writing proficiency; there will also be an oral presentation.

# Preliminary Examination for Part IA of the Classical Tripos

Further to their earlier Notice of 28 November 2012 (*Reporter*, 6287, 2012–13, p. 156), the Faculty Board of Classics give notice that with effect from the examination to be held in 2013 the form of the examination for the following paper for the Preliminary Examination for Part IA of the Classical Tripos will be as specified below:

Paper 2. Latin questions.

The paper will be divided into two sections.

Section (a) will contain two passages of Latin for unseen translation. Each passage will account for 25% of the marks available for the paper.

Section (b) will contain

- (i) English sentences for translation into Latin (accounting, in total, for 25% of the marks available for the paper), and
- (ii) a passage for linguistic comment from the texts prescribed for Paper 1 (accounting for 25% of the marks available for the paper).

All other papers remain unchanged. The Faculty Board is satisfied that no candidate's preparation for the examination in 2013 will be affected.

# Graces submitted to the Regent House on 6 February 2013

The Council submits the following Graces to the Regent House. These Graces, unless they are withdrawn or a ballot is requested in accordance with the regulations for Graces of the Regent House (*Statutes and Ordinances*, p. 107), will be deemed to have been approved at 4 p.m. on Friday, 15 February 2013.

**1.** That the regulations for the Joint Committee on Development (*Statutes and Ordinances*, p. 140) be rescinded and replaced by the regulations set out below.<sup>1</sup>

# JOINT COMMITTEE ON DEVELOPMENT

- 1. The Joint Committee on Development shall be a joint Committee of the Council and the Colleges and shall consist of:
  - (a) the Vice-Chancellor and the Chairman of the Colleges Committee (ex officio) who shall be co-Chairmen;
  - (b) a member of the Council appointed by the Council;
  - (c) three members of the Regent House appointed by the Council, on the nomination of the General Board, who shall normally be persons having experience of fund-raising at the University level, one of whom shall be a Head of School;
  - (d) a Head of House appointed by the Colleges' Standing Committee;
  - (e) four persons appointed by the Colleges' Standing Committee having regard to their experience of fund-raising for the Colleges;
  - (f) the Director of Development and Alumni Relations;
  - (g) the Executive Director of Cambridge in America.

Members in classes (b) to (e) shall be appointed in the Michaelmas Term to serve for three years from 1 January next following their appointment. The Registrary, the Academic Secretary, and the Director of the Finance Division of the University Offices shall have the right to attend meetings of the Committee.

- 2. The Registrary shall designate a University officer to act as Secretary to the Joint Committee.
- 3. The duties of the Joint Committee shall be:
- (a) to monitor the performance of, and recommend revisions to, the overall strategy for fund-raising on behalf of the University and the Colleges;
- (b) to keep under review and facilitate the relationships and links between the University and the Colleges and their members;
- (c) to facilitate and support effective collaboration between the University and the Colleges;
- (d) to receive and review the budget and work plan for collaborative activity in fund-raising undertaken through the office of Cambridge in America in the USA, and any such similar bodies that may be established in future on a jointly funded basis elsewhere in the world, and to recommend them to the Planning and Resources Committee for approval.
- 2. That Regulation 1 for the Craig Taylor Fund (Statutes and Ordinances, p. 796) be amended so as to read:
- 1. The income of the Craig Taylor Fund shall be used to provide one or more annual prizes, to be called the Craig Taylor Prizes, which shall be awarded by the Board of Examiners for Part IA, Part IB, or Part II of the Philosophy Tripos to the candidates who have shown the greatest distinction in any Part of the Philosophy Tripos, or in any component of any Part of the Tripos as the Faculty Board of Philosophy shall from time to time specify.

- **4.** That the title of the degree of Doctor of Science *honoris causa* be conferred under Statute B, IV upon ADA YONATH, Martin S. and Helen Kimmel Professor of Structural Biology and Director of the Helen and Milton A. Kimmelman Center for Biomolecular Structure and Assembly, Weizmann Institute of Science, Israel, Nobel Laureate.
