### Statutes approved

31 October 2022

The Registry has received notice from the Clerk of the Privy Council that His Majesty the King, at a Council held on 12 October 2022, was pleased to approve amendments to Statutes J 7 and A X 2(b), which were submitted in accordance with Grace 1 of 3 November 2021 following a ballot (*Reporter*, 6640, 2021–22, p. 171).

The changes revise the method for determining the membership of the Regent House of those in the Press and Assessment Department, and amend a definition to reflect changes to the criteria for Regent House membership.

### Elections to the Council and the Board of Scrutiny

Elections are taking place this term to appoint eight members of the Council for four years from 1 January 2023. There is also an election to appoint a member of the Board of Scrutiny with immediate effect until 30 September 2023. The deadline for nominations in these elections is 12 noon on Friday, 11 November 2022. Full details of the nomination procedure and election timetable, including links to nomination forms, were published in the *Reporter* on 5 October 2022 (*Reporter*, 6670, 2022–23, p. 29).

### Procedure for the Review of Decisions of University Bodies

28 October 2022

#### With immediate effect

The General Board has agreed to amend the Schedule to its Procedure for the Review of Decisions of University Bodies (reproduced in *Statutes and Ordinances*, 2021, p. 224). The Procedure provides the University with a means to review decisions taken in relation to individual students by a number of different bodies and issue a Completion of Procedures letter, using a process that is in line with guidance issued by the Office of the Independent Adjudicator. The Schedule sets out the bodies whose decisions are included within the scope of the Procedure. The list of bodies has been updated to include the Accessibility and Disability Resource Centre.
